It was on a chilly winter night I landed in Tbilisi, the capital of Georgia Republic. Arriving without a proper visa and with a sewn up Indian passport, though made a commotion at the immigration at first, finally they let me go. But that wee hours of the day, at the deserted Airport, it was impossible for a public transport to the city.

But soon, I was given a lift, which later changed my Georgia days in toto for ever. Mariyam and her father came to see off someone, seeing a coloured man alone outside the terminal in a cold winter night, they had no choice, but to tender help.

While alighting from the car in Skadaveli hostel, near Freedom Square, Mariyam scribbled her cell number on my mobile notepad. She asked me to wait for her call in the morning. May be, they were fascinated with my pep talk about my love affair with Georgia and my solo Sojourns across the Globe.

Georgia is a Ex-Soviet Republic in the valley of Caucasus mountains. It is a land with magnificent history and unparalleled natural beauty. Christianity was introduced here almost the same time as St.Thomas came to Kerala. By 4th Century AD it became national state religion.

It was 10 in the morning, the hostel owner cum manager Mr. Irkali informed me that, I had a guest. To my great surprise it was Mariyam, though sad to say, after the morning nap I had fully forgotten her.

That was the beginning. Since then till I departed Georgia she was my friend, guide, philosopher. Actually Tbilisi is such a small place, where there is nothing much to see, no palaces nor any great colonial buildings. But, there are lots and lots of Churches, and they are omnipresent. It includes grand old ones to the latest versions. If all the churches are not enough to show you how religious Georgians are, just watch for the number of people who make a symbol of cross in the forehead or chest each time they pass a church, will.



Mariyam took me to all the main Churches and Cathedrals in and around Tbilisi and even made me attend Mass and other Church ceremonies. We went to the ultra modern Byzantine like Sameba Cathedral to the medieval built and rustically charming Metekhi Church.

The most remarkable place of the capital is on the banks of the Mtkvari river. The tree lined promanades on both sides of the river is romantic to the core in the evenings. The swaying trees on the banks dip their branches along the river with the countless fishermen waiting for a bountiful catch, is a magnificent photo stop. Across the river is a awesome sulfur bath. For 2 Lari (Georgian Currency), 60 rupees you can have a wonderful bath with a central Asian feel. On proceeding further, a steep climb will take to the Narikela Fort. Though the fort has nothing great to offer, but the view from the top will hold your breath. For sure the word Spectacular will not convey the exact feel. Continuing further along the top of the ridge there is a big metal statue, Mother Georgia. But, watch your step, it is a long way down.

In the evenings and nights all along the river banks, rainbow bridges, churches, Narikela fort gets illuminated. Sitting on the river bank sipping famed Georgian wines and savouring traditional Georgian delicacies like Khimkali Dumplings will make you murmur, life is worth living.

Rustaveli Avenue is the main artery of Tbilisi. It starts from the Freedom Square and is one and half kilometer long. All the major buildings and sites of the capital are all this avenue. Parliament building, National Museum, Opera House, Science Academy, all situated along this street.

With sublimely perched old churches and castles along with breath taking mountain scenery, outrageously beautiful small towns, all abounds in natural beauty, no doubt it is one of the most beautiful countries on Earth. But to my utter surprise there are no tourists at all in Georgia. More over a coloured person like me is rarest of the rare.

With Mariyam, when we walk together, or ride in a metro, I can gauge the curiosity in the eyes of the onlookers. But I can vouch there is no sinister connotation. Because they are some of the most hospitable people in the whole world. Some times, to quench the inquisitiveness someone will desperately ask Mariyam in the local vernacular, who is the man with her, instead replying directly, she will turn to me and with a wink in her eyes, will say "Miq'varkhar" (I love you).



Many of our readers who couldn't follow Malayalam had requested me to ask Dr. Natarajan to switch over to English, so that they also will get an opportunity to 'visit' different places through his travelogue. Dr. Natarajan promptly agreed. - Editor
